

## APPLICATION & INFORMATION SHEET

### **ANTH 322: Summer Field School in Archaeology (3 credits) Summer Session I June 1 – July 1, 2004**

The University of South Carolina's summer field school in Urban archaeology will include a mix of undergraduate & graduate students, and possibly volunteers. Students will gain hands-on experience in the fundamentals of archaeological surveying, site location, excavation, mapping, artifact identification, data-recording, and laboratory analysis. Students will explore archival, remote sensing, and other forms of evidence about the history of the site and past residents. We will also take part in public archaeology, educating visitors from around Columbia. Field school participants will have an opportunity to visit colonial and postbellum plantations and urban sites in Charleston and Columbia. Leland Ferguson, *Uncommon Ground* (1992) and Jim Deetz's *In Small Things Forgotten* are excellent introductions to historical archaeology.

In addition to tuition (see cost information sheet below) and a technology fee, students pay a \$20 fee that will cover laboratory and field supplies, including the cost of a required field manual. Various handouts will supplement the manual. Non-degree or non-USC students must also submit a separate application form to the University of South Carolina (that includes a \$10 fee). Housing is available upon request (notify Dr. Weik as soon as possible). Meals and food are offered by a variety of restaurants and a grocery store near campus.

Grades will be based on attendance, field notes, a laboratory exercise, a survey/map exercise, a summary exercise, and the timely completion of tasks for the project. Participants should be healthy enough to perform some strenuous work on hot days.

Application to the instructor is required for admittance to the program . Please note that University guidelines will apply to the use of all non-prescription drugs and alcohol, and that smoking will not be allowed in the excavation.

Students admitted into the field school will receive further information by mail ASAP.
