

CHILD AND FAMILY RESEARCH: THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH

CAROLINA: The Department of Psychology at the University of South Carolina invites applications for two tenure-track positions at the assistant professor level in the area of child and family research. Candidates should have a program of research that fits one or more of the following themes in relation to children and families: developmental psychopathology and resilience, prevention science, community or policy intervention, health disparities, and cultural diversity issues. Potential for extramural funding will be a key consideration among candidates. There is a preference for candidates who can contribute to training in the doctoral program in Clinical-Community Psychology (e.g., license eligible or similar applied training). The Clinical-Community program is an APA accredited program in Clinical Psychology that has been recognized nationally for high faculty productivity.

The University of South Carolina is the flagship state university (Carnegie Foundation “very high research activity” ranking) located in the capital city of Columbia SC, a growing urban center with a population of about 500,000. Centrally located in the midlands of South Carolina, (a two-hour drive to the beach and to the mountains), Columbia offers cultural, sporting, and recreational activities coupled with a moderate cost-of-living.
