### ANTH 322M Summer Field School in Archaeology University of South Carolina-Columbia

Students will gain hands-on experience in archaeological excavation at the 18<sup>th</sup> century (AD) Native American town of Palachacolas. This town was established by a group of Apalachicola Indians who migrated from the lower Chattahoochee to the Savannah River in order to engage in trade and relations with the colony of Carolina. The purpose of this field school is to evaluate the impact of colonialism on indigenous societies.

Students will be in residence at the Webb Wildlife Center in Hampton County on Monday through Friday each of the three weeks of the Maymester course. In addition to regular university fees, there will be a fee of \$500 per student to cover room and board expenses.
