**Course Description:**

This course will examine courts within the framework of a larger criminal justice system. Attention will be given to the judicial process from arrest to trial. In addition, the role of various courtroom actors will be examined in light of how their decisions influence case outcomes.

**Text:**

David W. Neubauer, America's Courts and the Criminal Justice System (8<sup>th</sup> edition). (Wadsworth 2005)

**Grading:**

There will be four tests and one exam consisting of forty questions each. The lowest test or exam score will be dropped. At the end of the semester the four highest test or exam scores plus any extra credit points earned will be totaled. The following is the grading scale:

147 - 160 points = A  
142 - 146 points = B+  
134 - 141 points = B  
129 - 133 points = C+  
121 - 128 points = C  
108 - 120 points = D  
below 108 points = F

All Scantron answer sheets turned in for credit must have the following legibly written in and bubbled in dark enough that the Scantron reader records the information:

**Name Legibly Printed, Student Number, Date and Test Form:** A, B, C, D, etc. marked and bubbled in the proper boxes on Scantron answer sheet.

If the Scantron answer sheet does not meet all the requirements the student will receive a zero for the test.

All paper copies of Tests handed out must be returned with the following written on the test:

If any Test is not turned back in with the requirements listed above the student will receive a zero for the test.

All other items turned in for credit must have the following or will receive zero credit:

Grades will be posted on Blackboard after each test and the final exam. This will normally occur within three work/school days but may be delayed due to computer problems or other unforeseen human or machine difficulties.

To aid the educational process:

All students are encouraged to use all available resources, supplements, practice exams, etc... provided by the text book publisher. For this course the resources, if any, can be found at the publisher's website.

### **Examinations:**

Four tests and the final exam will be given. Any missed test will be entered as a zero. Any make up tests must be taken before the next class period. **All make up tests will automatically be reduced by one letter grade.**

The questions on the tests and the final exam will be based both on the text and on the material covered in class. Tests and examinations may include a combination of objective, true or false, multiple choice and essay questions. Bring a #2 pencil to all tests and the final exam. All hats with brims (i.e. baseball, sunshade visors, etc.) must be removed or worn backwards during exams by everyone in class.

### **Attendance:**

Attendance will be taken in each class. Absence from more than five of the scheduled classes **(whether excused or unexcused)** is excessive and will result in one full grade penalty toward your final grade. Absence from more than 10 scheduled classes will result in two full grade penalties toward your final grade.

Attendance may be taken at the beginning, the middle or the end of class. Any student who is not present when attendance is taken will be marked absent. If a student comes to class after attendance has been taken they will be marked absent. Any student who leaves class early will be marked absent.

Attendance will be posted on Blackboard and will be updated each time test grades are posted.
