Medical Anthropologist

The faculty of the Department of Anthropology at the University of South Carolina seek a medical anthropologist with expertise in participatory, community-based research methodologies for a tenure-track assistant professorship to begin in August 2007. The candidate is part of a hiring initiative of two faculty in the Departments of Anthropology and Health Promotion Education and Behavior (Arnold School of Public Health), who will strengthen existing interdisciplinary research in the areas of social inequalities, health disparities, immigration, and community development at USC. USC is committed to research on health inequalities/disparities and is also currently advertising positions in the area of African-American Health Disparities. Candidates must bring a strong record or promise of scholarly achievement and extramural funding in community-based participatory research and social determinants of health and well-being, and/or community health development. Candidates will be expected to contribute to interdisciplinary health inequalities/disparities research in Latino or immigrant populations in South Carolina and the southeast US. Candidates will collaborate and strengthen ongoing efforts from the Consortium of Latino Immigration, the Institute for Families in Society, the Women's Studies Program Women's Well-Being Initiative, and several existing community projects that address health inequalities in marginalized and minority communities in South Carolina. The position is full time in the Department of Anthropology, with the possibility for a joint appointment with the Women's Studies Program at USC (www.cas.sc.edu/wost). The Department of Anthropology is committed to a four-field disciplinary approach, and has a new Ph.D. program focusing on global diasporic connections as well as the study of social inequalities and health disparities at the local, national and international contexts.
