In the years following the conclusion of the Great War for Empire, South Carolinians became increasingly unhappy with the actions of the British Government vis-à-vis the colonies. Revolution led to a new nation, but the independent nature that Carolinians had exhibited since the 17th century did not disappear. It was not long before the South Carolinians began to question the nature of the union they had helped create. In 1860, for the third time in its history, the people of the state decided to secede from the government of which it was a part.
